The 19th Annual E-Fair: A Record-Breaker!

This year's Entrepreneurial Fair was an overwhelming success! The process was long but rewarding in so many ways. First, thirty-four student-led companies with over 100 young entrepreneurs survived the Dragon's Den selection process in April. Then they advertised, mass-produced, and sold their products over the course of 3 lunch hours. The strongest trends this year were toward exotic desserts (Dubai Chocolate anyone?) and healthy meals. Our students and staff poured over the menus and devoured every morsel, leaving 95% of the companies with sold-out inventories! The results? Record-breaking revenues of \$12694, and a net profit of over \$7500, most of which will be returned to the grads as prizes and bursaries! (The rest is used to fund local charities and future CRHS projects.)

EXAM PREPARATION-- TIPS AND TRICKS

With June Exams underway, it's important to put in the time to study not only harder, but smarter. Here are some tips and tricks!

Instead of rereading notes, quiz yourself regularly.

Try to retrieve information from memory — it strengthens neural connections and boosts retention.

Space out study sessions over time instead of cramming.

Review material at increasing intervals to move it into long-term memory.

Explaining concepts to someone else helps clarify your understanding.

If you can't teach it simply, you may not understand it well enough yet.

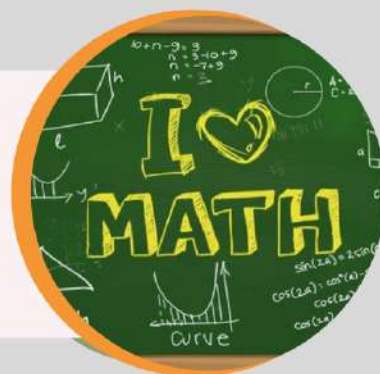


Flag Football

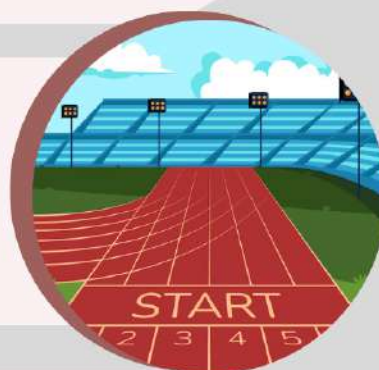


WOTP Trip to Montreal
