COURSE OUTLINE

Subject: Geography Level: Secondary 1

Course Description & Objectives:

This course is designed to provide students with the tools for understanding the organization of a territory and certain geographic phenomena. Furthermore, students will be introduced to territorial and global issues that are affecting parts of the world. Geographic techniques such as reading and interpreting maps, research, and atlas work will be developed.

Course Content:

Students will learn about global and territorial geographic phenomena to better understand the connections between the world's different territories. The main units of study include:

- An Urban Territory
- The Agricultural Territory
- Natural Hazards in Urban Territories
- A Protected Territory
- The Tourism Territory

Subject Specific Competencies:

- Competency 1: Understands the organization of a territory
- Competency 2: Interprets a territorial issue
- Competency 3: Constructs his/her consciousness of global citizenship

Evaluation:

Evaluation will be based on assignments, projects, group work, quizzes, and end of term evaluation situations. The class teacher will provide students with more details of the methods of evaluation for each term. Students will receive one mark that reflects their ability to master the course competencies.

Students will use a textbook. Students will also have activities and handouts that support the competencies and content covered in class.
