SUBJECT: History & Citizenship Education

Level: Cycle 1, Year 2 (Sec. 2)

Course Description & Objectives:

This course is designed to continue the program of year one, and to enable students to develop their study of history and better understand the impact that history has on present and future societies. Furthermore, students are challenged to become informed and active citizens.

Course Content:

Students will learn about the social phenomena that constitute times of major historical changes. The main social phenomena being studied include:

- A new vision of humanity
- European expansion in the world
- The American or French revolution
- Industrialization
- Imperialism and colonization
- Winning of civil rights and freedoms

Subject Specific Competencies:

- Competency 1: Examines social phenomena from a historical perspective
- Competency 2: Interprets social phenomena using the historical method
- Competency 3: Constructs his/her consciousness of citizenship through the study of history

Evaluation:

Evaluation will be based on assignments, projects, group work, quizzes, and end of term evaluation situations. The class teacher will provide students with more details of the methods of evaluation for each term. Students will receive one mark that reflects their ability to master the course competencies.
