If you have already applied to the Fall 2016 semester and you wish to take part in Round 3:

- Select "Consult my file" and after logging in, modify your choice using the option in the left hand menu.
- Select a new choice of program and/or college amongst the available places appearing in the Table of available spaces for Round 3. Your new choice must be saved in your online file **no later than May 25, 2016, 11:59 p.m.**

IMPORTANT NOTICE: You do not have to complete a new application or pay an additional \$30.

If your school has not concluded an agreement with SRAM for the electronic transfer of your school marks and if you have received additional school marks since Round 2, you may send these to SRAM.

If this is your first application for the Fall 2016 semester:

- First read the complete application instructions at www.sram.qc.ca/first-application
- Go to SRAM's Omnivox online application system (<http://sram.omnivox.ca>) and follow the directions outlined on the screen.
 - You will need to provide personal information.
 - You will then need to choose a cégep and program, and in some cases a particularity with regards to your program of choice. Consult the Table of Available Spaces for Round 3 to make a choice. It is useless to choose a program where no places are available since you will be automatically refused.
 - You will have to pay the application fees (\$30 non-refundable).

NOTICE: Only applications completed by the deadline of each round will be forwarded to the College for evaluation. For the Round 3, applications must be completed by **May 25, 2016, 11:59 p.m.**

You must provide all requested documents and verify that they have been received by SRAM. Check the status of your documents and of your application under the "Status of your application" option online. Please allow a minimum delay of 24 hours for documents to be Processed.

PRECISIONS FOR FALL 2016 ADMISSION

Important additional information or requirements apply to certain programs in certain cégeps. The online table of available programs available at <http://sram.omnivox.ca> details out all of these precisions.

- A** Applicants to these programs may be invited to tests and/or interviews and/or auditions that normally take place at the given college.
- B** There is an Affirmative Action Program for admission in Police Technology at the following colleges: Ahuntsic, de Maisonneuve and John Abbott. To obtain the questionnaire that must be sent along with the Transmission Receipt to SRAM, please contact your high school or one of these cégeps.
- C** Administration and registration fees are required for the International Baccalaureate exams.
- D** Applicants must comply with the prerequisites and precisions of these two programs. Please consult the cégep's website to see if there are options to choose from.
- E** Applicants applying to a preparatory session will have to indicate which program they are planning to attend once they've completed the preparatory session. They should also access the college's website for information regarding the services offered as part of the preparatory session.
- F** Applicants to these programs may be required to take a medical examination or vaccination.
- G** This program pertains to students who have obtained a specific SSVD. Please consult the cégep's website to verify their admission requirements.
- H** Some cégeps offer a DEP-DEC pathway in this program for applicants who have obtained a specific SSVD. Please consult the cégep's website to verify their admission requirements.

- S** In certain cégeps, the applicant must have completed one of the following prerequisites to be admissible to the path with mathematics : Secondary 5 Technical and Scientific Mathematics Option OR Secondary 5 Science Mathematics Option OR Mathematics 526.
- T** This program is offered in partnership with cégep de Saint-Jérôme. The 3rd and 4th semesters and the first seven weeks of the 5th semester are held at cégep de Saint-Jérôme.
- U** For this program offered at Cégep de Saint-Hyacinthe, the student will have to take classes in Saint-Hyacinthe and Montreal, according to a schedule set in the beginning of each semester.
- W** Special fees are required for an international internship included in this program.
